Superintendent Eaton is still awaiting a decision from the board on purchasing a Western Star 10 wheeler at state bid price of \$ 259,014.96. Board asked that Phil get updated current finance info and further discussion will take place next month.

Truck #25 is looking at approx. \$5000 in repairs.

Resolved that Pursuant to the Records Retention and Disposition Schedule MU-1 all records mentioned above shall be disposed of either by shredding or burning.

SUPERVISOR:

The Indian Land Claim income for 2020 will not be received, therefore no money will be put into building fund. Councilman Dowd asked that a letter be written to County Legislator voicing disagreement with decision as there is a signed contract.

Remaining money in the Land Claim account will be saved in case Councilman Dowd's project is carried out, \$25,000 will be moved to within the fund FTGS. Councilman Dowd needs to check and advise the Supervisor of the status on this grant. If grant does not come through, then a referendum needs to be put out to the public as we do not have authority to spend taxpayer funds without one, pending final cost.

Sales Tax Check for the first quarter has been lowered by 2/3. We are suppose to be receiving the balance in the next 2 months, but by then we will be owed another check. Status of that is unknown. Sales Tax was down 24.4% in April and 32.3% in May.

Chips funding that we are supposed to be getting is at 80% at this time.

Supervisor asked for a Budget Adjustment.

Supervisor Collins stated that plans for reval need to be discontinued for 2020 – 2021.

Councilman Peck asked where we stand on roadwork. Hgwy. Superintendent Eaton said that Scharman road will be done but Rottamore road will have to wait. Councilman Peck reiterated the importance of keeping up on the roads and feels that must be done.

Questions were asked regarding whether Planning and Zoning has anything in writing for solar or

Councilman Dowd stated that in his opinion, Town employees should not have been put on leave

In response Supervisor Collins stated that she was issued legislative guidance when she declared Augusta in a State of Emergency due to COVID.

Supervisor Collins made a motion at 6:48 PM, seconded by Councilman Russell to enter into Executive Session to discuss the financial history of a particular person(s) or corporation, or matters leading to the appointment, employment, promotion, demotion, discipline, suspension, dismissal or removal of a particular person(s) or corporation.

At 6:58 PM, the board came out of Executive Session.

With no further business, on a motion of Councilman Peck seconded by Councilman Russell, the meeting was adjourned at 7:00 PM. Carried unanimously.
